Attendants to the bride were Vivienne Inez Bluedorn, sister-in-

law of the bride, and her daughter, Marlana Bluedorn.

Attending the groom were his son, Benjamin Hawley, Daniel Bluedorn, brother of the bride, and his son, Michael Bluedorn.

A traditional dance followed, with drums and songs performed by Clyde Heavy Runner, Michael Heavy Runner and John Ground.

Family and guests enjoyed a traditional feast of serviceberry soup and buffalo roast prepared by Darrell and Angelika Norman of Lodgepole Gallery. Guests included family, friends, members of the Blackfeet Nation, and visitors from Germany and Sweden.
